Guillermo Cordero is **Assistant Professor in the Department of Political Science** and International Relations and **Vice-Dean of Research** of the Faculty of Law at the ***Universidad Autónoma de Madrid***. Previously he held postdoctoral teaching and research positions at the ***Universitat Pompeu Fabra*** in Barcelona and pre-doctoral research positions at the *Center for Advanced Studies in the Social Sciences (CEACS, Juan March Institute)* in Madrid.

He has been research fellow at the ***University of Essex***, the ***University of Michigan***, the ***University of Montreal*** and the ***University of Berkeley***. He holds a PhD in Political Science (2012) as well as a MA in Democracy and Government (2009).

Currently, he is the **principal investigator of the project “¿Ayuntamientos plurales? La representación política de los inmigrantes en España”** on the political representation of immigrants in Spain, financed by the Spanish Ministry of Economy and Competitiveness. He is also the Coordinator of the Research Group “*Actores y Élités Políticas*”.
